# Exciting matches with teams heading for the decisive stage of the tournament (I)

Second day full of matches in the Fernando Argüelles Pavilion on the occasion of the celebration of the World University Handball Championship. After what was played yesterday, both men's and women's teams, who want to aspire to the maximum in the important rounds, have taken a step forward with excellent results that have positioned them at the top of the rankings of the different groups. All the boys' matches were played in the morning and the girls' in the afternoon.

## Spain claim their second win as Poland and France show their strength in depth in their matches.

The University Warriors are still on a winning streak and are not taking their foot off the accelerator. Their presence in the semi-finals is guaranteed, with only first place still to be confirmed. Their second matchday was more feasible than the first, as they came up against weaker opponents like India, who have fewer resources to cope with the level of handball of players who are used to competing week after week in the Asobal League. It was a procedure that was faced with the intention of maintaining positive feelings and sharing out minutes so that everyone would be ready for the more decisive matches that will come in the next few days. The final score was 42-15 in favour of Spain.





# Exciting matches with teams heading for the decisive stage of the tournament (II)

In Group A, with the hosts setting the tempo, Brazil and Poland were in the thick of things as both countries aim to earn a place in the semi-finals of the tournament. The Polish team, having lost the first game, needed to win and came out with a lot of ambition and their best attack was a formidable defensive effort that allowed them to shine in the offensive phase. The Brazilian team found it difficult to present opposition on either side of the court and were conditioned by an adverse scoreline. The second place is tightened with the victory of Poland (18-34) who will have a more comfortable match against India and Brazil will have to face the hosts, Diego Dorado's boys.

In the men's draw, the first match of the morning ended in the opposite way to how it started. The balance between France and Chile broke down in favour of the former as the minutes went by. The latter were able to attack the open defence well, but became less and less effective. The French players improved their performance and set themselves the objective of closing out the game as quickly as possible and achieving the widest possible goal difference. They adjusted their defensive system, going for a strong 6:0 and an intense 5:1, and Chile could no longer put up any more resistance despite trying and went down 49-10.





# Exciting matches with teams heading for the decisive stage of the tournament (III)

## Poland takes the lead in Group B and France and the Netherlands both score big wins

The women's competition took centre stage again in the afternoon at the Fernando Argüelles Pavilion with a match between France and India that quickly went the way of the French, who won 8-51. A result that leaves the scoreboard intact in Group A where, tomorrow Wednesday, the French team will face the Spanish team to fight for the first position before the semifinals, just after the break scheduled in the University World Cup calendar.

The most exciting game had two clear protagonists: Czech Republic and Poland. Both teams were brave from the start, going all out in every single action. It was an exchange of blows that made the spectators enjoy it. The girls from the Polish team were a little more accurate and were able to manage short advantages on the scoreboard and, most importantly, to withstand the moments of the game when their opponents were better and were very close. At half-time, the score was 13-16 and 28-30 at the end. The script of the game did not change too much in the second half, the back and forth and the alternation of good attacks and defence continued until Poland celebrated their victory.





# Exciting matches with teams heading for the decisive stage of the tournament (IV)

The second day of intense handball was rounded off with a Netherlands - Chile match in group B of the tournament. A balanced match at the start that was broken up by the strong defence and fast counter-attacking of the Europeans, while the losses were a heavy burden for the South Americans who, in spite of this, tried to continue in the fight not to give up because of an adverse score that, in the end, could not be avoided and the Dutch celebrated their first joy in the tournament (41-25).

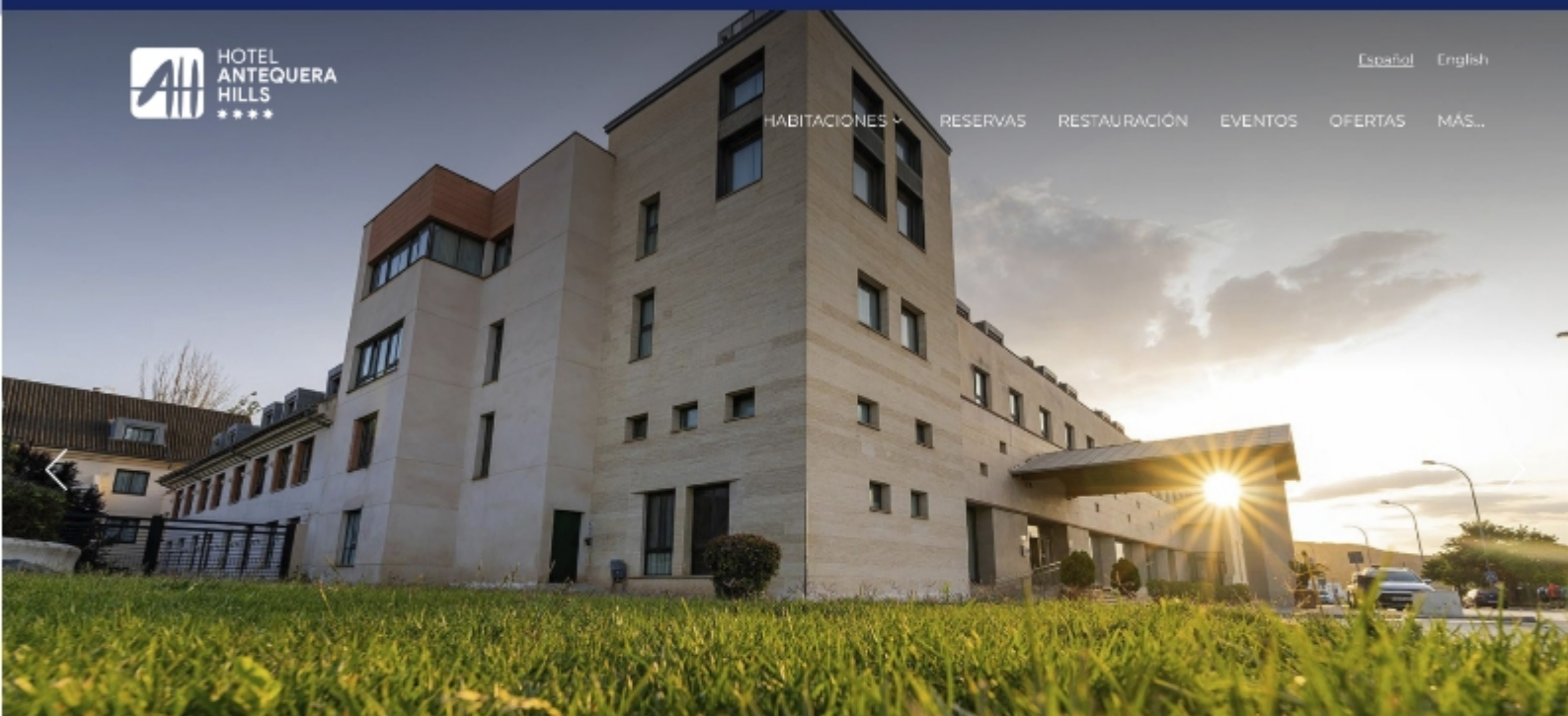

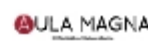
