Transportation

Official main entry point:

Malaga Airport (AGP), officially known as Malaga-Costa del Sol airport and sometimes called Pablo Picasso Airport, is situated at 7 km southwest of Malaga's city centre.



It is the most important airport of the Autonomous Community of Andalusia, occupying the fourth place among the Spanish airports and the twenty second among the European Union. It is also considered as the main entrance or exit gate for tourism to/from the famous "Costa del Sol" (means coast of the sun) and the rest of Andalusia.

Important information for all delegations and the international referees at their arrival:

When you land in Malaga and get off the plane, there will be volunteers from the organisation in the baggage belt area welcoming you. You will be able to identify them by the following sign:



They will guide you to the shuttle that will transport you from the airport to the hotel. Please note that you may need to wait for the shuttle to be fully loaded. If you encounter any problems, you can contact the Organising Committee through two methods:

Transportation



For those arriving directly in Antequera, whether at the bus station or either of the two train stations, transportation to the accommodation will also be provided.

Please note that for members of the delegation who do not arrive with the rest of the delegation on the same within similar time transportation will only be provided if the Organising Committee has been informed beforehand.

During the event:

A dedicated shuttle will be available for all delegations from the hotel to the Fernando Argüelles sports venue. The Agustin Rodriguez sports venue is located directly opposite the hotel, so no transportation is necessary. Additional information will be provided during the General Technical Meeting.

Transportation will also be provided for International Referees to both sports venues, as they will be accommodated in a hotel that is located a bit further away.

Rooming:

Most of the delegation members will be accommodated in double twin rooms. However, some of them will be accommodated in triple rooms.

The head of the delegation will always be accommodated in a single room.

Catering:

Catering will be served buffet-style, offering a variety of options tailored for athletes. Any intolerances or allergies must be communicated in advance. The is schedule is as follows:

- Breakfast: 07:30-10:30. Breakfast cannot be extended beyond 10:30, but it is possible to request access starting at 07:00 with at least one day's notice.
- Lunch: 13:30-15:30. The lunch hour can be extended from 13:00 to 16:00 provided that notice is given at least one day in advance.
- Dinner: 20:00-22:30. The dinner schedule can only be extended until 23:00 if notice is given at least one day in advance.

To modify any of the schedules for a team, it must be communicated with 24 hours' notice.

Sports Venues

There will be two sports venues during the competition: Fernando Argüelles and Agustin Rodriguez.

Fernando Argüelles:

This indoor arena has a capacity for 2,200 people, featuring a floating parquet floor with dimensions of 44×26 meters. Inaugurated on August 10, 1980, it underwent a complete renovation in the summer of 2006. The facilities include 6 collective changing rooms and 2 individual ones, a press room, an anti-doping room, an infirmary room, a VIP lounge, and two multipurpose rooms, along with modern facilities adapted to events of any level.

The Fernando Argüelles sports centre has become a reference in recent years for hosting national and international events such as the Handball King's Cups in 2010 and 2022, the Futsal King's Cups in 2012 and 2023, the Futsal Super Cup in 2017, as well as numerous international qualifying matches for national handball teams.

Agustin Rodriguez (Mauli):

This covered facility located just in front of the Antequera Hills Hotel was built in 2004 and has undergone different renovations to adapt it to the current needs of federated competitions. The sports hall has a capacity of 500 spectators and features a recently remodelled synthetic surface.














































Information

Training sessions

Based on the earlier instructions for submitting training requests, we have decided that requests sent to handball2024@ucjc.edu will be organized by the following criteria:

- 1) Teams that do not compete that day will have preference.
- 2) The schedule will be assigned in the order of requests received.

While we would have liked to accommodate evervone's preferred training slots, constraints make this impractical. Therefore, trainings will last 1 hour, and if there is availability, 1.5-hour trainings will be allowed. The Organising Committee believes this approach ensures fairness under the circumstances.

Activities on June 27 (Thursday)

On June 27, there are only 2 matches that start at 10:00. That is why the Organising Committee has organised these activities, in case you want to get to know a bit better the beautiful city of Antequera.

- · 9:00 to 12:00: Guided tour of the Archaeological Ensemble of the Dolmens of Antequera and the City Museum.
- 12:00 to 14:00: Panoramic guided tour of the Historic District of the city.
- 20:00 to 23:00 (special opening hours): Guided tour with audio guide of the Monumental Complex of the Alcazaba and the Royal Collegiate Church of Santa María la Mayor. Audio quides are available in Spanish, English, German, French, Dutch, Italian, Russian, and Japanese.

Depending on the matches on Thursday and the participating teams, this calendar of activities may be modified.

Official dinner

This official reception requires the presence of representatives from all delegations. The dinner will be held on June 27th at 8:30 PM at the Antequera Hills Hotel. Each delegation is invited to send two members to attend. The dress code is smart casual.

Gifts presented by the delegations will be acknowledged during this event, with due recognition given to the sponsors.

































Information

Streaming and photos

All matches at the Fernando Argüelles sports venue will be streamed live on FISU TV. At the end of each day, the streams will be uploaded to the cloud.

Matches at the Agustin Rodriguez sports venue will be recorded and uploaded to the cloud daily.

Additionally, photos from each day will also be uploaded to the cloud.

To access the information we will post a QR code in the hotel and in the pavilions.

Opening Ceremony

According to the official schedule, the opening ceremony is scheduled at 18:00 and it will last around 40 minutes.

Timings for delegations:

- · 17:15: Departure from the hotel for participants (walking to the event).
- · 17:30: Athletes gather at the entrance of the venue.
- 18:00: Ceremony begins.
- 18:05: Parade commences.

Attire for athletes and officials: Sports attire.

Attire for authorities: Business casual attire is suitable; formal attire is not required.

There will be volunteers guiding you during the whole opening ceremony (before and after).

Following the ceremony, all participants are welcome to stay and watch the first match between Spain and Poland, or they may return to the hotel for dinner.

Closing ceremony:

Immediately following the final match of the competition, the closing ceremony will commence. This event will feature a brief parade during which the awards will be presented and the championship will be officially concluded.

Upon the conclusion of these proceedings, the FISU Antequera 2024 World University Handball Championship will be formally closed.

































SPAIN

Spain is a country placed in south-western on the so-called Iberian Peninsula, bor- dered by the Mediterranean, the Atlantic Ocean, Portugaland France. It has had a very important and curious history, maybe because of the geographical location. It is well-known by the art, bull fights, "flamen- co", beaches, and the fact that there are so many hoursof sun throughout the year. However, Spain is much more than this, in-cluding its importance as being one of the cultural centres of Europe with cities that have a huge historic value and so many places which have created a country that is visited by millions of tourists every year.

MALAGA

Malaga is located in Andalusia in southern Spain. Its capitalis the birthplace of the painter Pablo Picasso, and home to monu- ments such as the AlcazabaArab citadel. It is also the settingfor the religious processions which form part of Malaga's Easter Week celebrations, declared a Festival of Tourist Interest. The province lies on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea, and has 160 km of coastline. Its gastronomy is mainly based on assortedfried fish dishes using the smaller fish (anchovies, mullet, mackerel...) and on typicalrecipes such as gazpacho.






































ANTEQUERA

Antequera is a wealthy town both cultur- ally and economically. Its historic centre is made up of monuments and buildings dating as far back as the BronzeAge.


The castle and Santa María Basilica can be found at the top of the town as well as a series of churches, monasteries and convents, palaces, and a citadel. It is well worth a trip to the El Torcal Nature Area nearby. Antequera is a great option to make this Championship happen. This city is known as "the heart of Andalusia" as it is located in the centre of the community.

It is a medium-sized city, about 45 km inland from the coast at Malaga. It became an important routefor travellers along history due to its location. All this makes Antequera the perfect place to make the World University Championship Handball take place.



DOLMENS

The Antequera Dolmens Archeological Site, in Antequera, is considered one of the best and best-known exam-ples of European megalithic complexes. It would be interesting to say that more than 95% of the recognized dolmens are positioned towards the south east, while Antequera Dolmenshave a different orientation.





































Nowadays, the famousarcheological group is being discussed because of the candidature for being added to UNESCO's World Heritage list. As our President of the Government claimed "there are more thanenough reasons" to be on the list and in fact, so many important people from Spain have sent severalmessages trying to give supports to the project. The actor Antonio Banderas or our Princess Leticia Ortiz have been ones

of the many ofthem who have tried to help with this purpose of getting the goal.

Summers tend to be dry and very hot, with an average temperature of 25°C (77°F) in July and August. During these months, days are longer and the city really begins to come alive in the evening the warm and pleasant midday sun.

WATER

In Antequera you'll find one of the safest tap waters.

OPENING HOURS

Shops in Spain open at 9 or 10am and close between 8 and 10pm, and most of them don't close over lunch.

Some - especially those far from the city centre - close from 2 to 4 or 5pm.

ELECTRICAL ADAPTORS

Electricity supply in Spain is 220V. Plugs have two round pins and an additional ground pin.

A standard travel adaptor plug will enable you to use appliances from abroad. Most hotels will supply you with one.

TAX FREE SHOPPING

If you come from a non-European Union country, you can claim VAT on items exceeding 90.15 euros. Show your tickets or receipts for the goods at the tax refund counters at Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas Airport.

Once customs officers have inspected your purchases and stamped your tickets, you can choose to send them back to the seller to have the money credited to your credit card or bank account. Alternatively, you

































can receive immediate payment through registered VAT refund agents, who typically charge handling fees.

To obtain a cash VAT refund at the airport, you must shop at stores displaying the "Tax Free for Tourists" sign and ask the sales assistant for a tax-free form showing the amount to be refunded. The VAT refund agent will ask you to hand over your forms before giving you the money.

HEALTHCARE

The Spanish National Health System comprises a widespread network of hospitals and healthcare centres that spans across the country. Healthcare centres provide primary care, while specialist service is available in hospitals, to which patients must be referred by a doctor. In addition, hospitals and some healthcare centres have an emergency service.

If you're an EU citizen, you and your family are eligible for medical care, so that you don't have to return to your country of origin for treatment. However, you should get the European.

Health Insurance Card (EHIC) in your country, or any equivalent document proving that you have medical insurance in a member state, since this will entitle you to prompt medical care wherever you are.

If you don't have this card (or an equivalent document), you'll still get immediate medical assistance, though you may be fully charged for it. You may claim a refund from your health insurance company, according to the medical costs applicable in the country where you received treatment.

MEDICINES

Medicines in Spain must be bought at pharmacies, which you'll easily spot by their green cross. Regardless of the time and the area where you are, you'll always

find one on duty, open round the clock. Antibiotics are sold on prescription only.

EMERGENCIES

In case of emergency (ambulance, fire and rescue, police), call 112, a toll-free number that works 24/7 across the EU, Spain included. The 112 call centre

immediately identifies the caller's location. It has interpreting services covering as many as 80 languages.

































FOREIGN TOURIST ASSISTANCE SERVICE

The Foreign Tourist Assistance Service (SATE) offers personal assistance to tourists who need to visit a police station for whatever reason.

Assistance is provided by a qualified team at the official tourism agency or by police officers. They help tourists lodge complaints or fill in forms.

ANTI-SMOKING LAW

In Spain, smoking is banned in all closed public and work premises, in other words including catering and accommodation establishments. You must be at least 18 years old to buy tobacco products.

Antequera will surprise you with its intense, enveloping blue sky. With a dry climate and little rainfall, the city has hot summers and cold winters. No matter what time of the year you choose to come.

































IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- 1. The World University Championship Handball aims to be a sustainable event. We believe in the well-being of our world, and we want to contribute positively. What does this mean in practice?
 - Instead of providing plastic water bottles at every match, we will give each member of the delegation a reusable bottle at the beginning of the championship, intended to last until the end. It is each member's responsibility to bring and use their bottle as needed. Water stations will be available at the Antequera Hills Hotel and at both official sports venues of the competition.
- 2. There will be a designated room in the hotel for team meetings. In case you are interested, you should let us know at handball2024@ucjc.edu and we will book it for you depending on availability.

- 3. During your stay at the hotel, you should follow this rules:
 - a. Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the rooms.
 - Bringing food and drinks from outside is not allowed.
 - Parties, gatherings, or social drinking events are not permitted in the rooms or common areas of the hotel.
 - d. Please always maintain an appropriate noise level for the well-being of all guests and try to be quiet in the hallways and staircases.
 - e. Guests who commit any type of misconduct (inappropriate behaviour, fights, etc.) may be expelled from the hotel.
