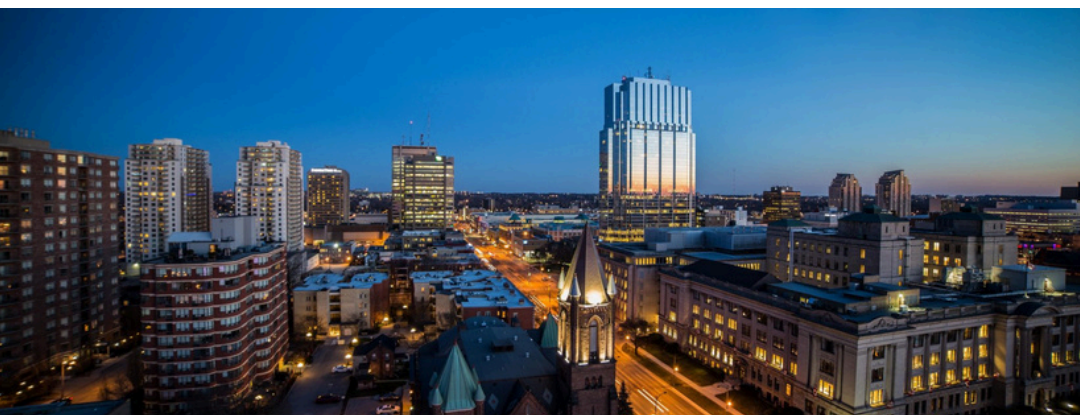

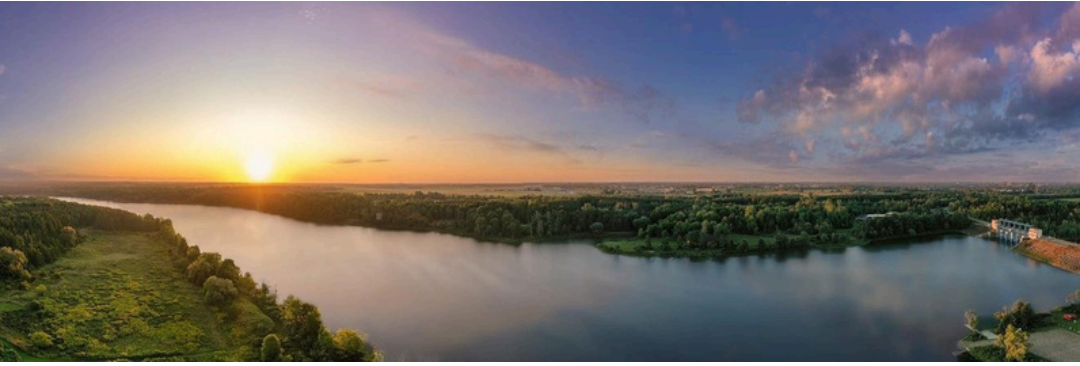

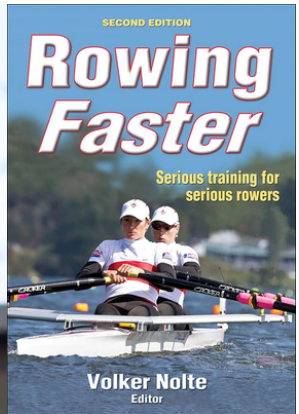

Additional Events

In addition to on-water training and racing, we are proud to offer a variety of additional programming designed to support the student-athlete experience. Eligibility

Only the athletes who comply with the following conditions may take part in a FISU World University Championship:

- a) Be a national of the country they represent;
- b) Be at least 18 and no older than 25 years of age on the 31st December of the year of the event; for 2026, athletes must be born between the 01/01/2001 and the 31/12/2008.

Only the following may participate as athletes in a FISU World University Championship:

- a) Students who are currently officially registered as proceeding towards a degree or diploma at a university or similar institute whose status is recognised by the appropriate national academic authority of their country;
- b) Former students of the institutions mentioned in a) who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the calendar year preceding the event.

Competition Venue

Competition and training will take place at the Doug Wells Training Centre located on Lake Fanshawe in London Ontario, Canada. This training centre is the home of the Western Mustangs Rowing Team and the former home of the Canadian National Team. Additional indoor training facilities will be available on the Western University campus.

Access to Fanshawe Lake is available through Fanshawe Conservation Area, located at 1424 Clarke Road. Upon arrival at Fanshawe Conservation Area, please stop at the entrance gate. Upon entering the park, look for signs and take your first right for parking at the rowing venue.



The competition venue consists of a 6 - lane standard Albano rowing course. Please note that spectators are welcome in the spectator area adjacent to the finish tower. Spectators however, will not be permitted in the athlete area.

Equipment

BOAT RENTAL

The organizing committee will provide the boats and oars at a charge of €45 per seat per day for crews travelling overseas (i.e. not from the North American continent – including Canada, US and Mexico). Equipment rentals will be set at a standard time-frame from Monday August 10th to Saturday August 15th at the above rate. No partial time window will be accepted. Your equipment will be confirmed once 50% deposit is received.

Hudson Boat Works and local clubs are our partners for boats. Accessories such as a CoxBox and Speedcoach are not provided. 8+’s will be equipped with Nielsen-Kellerman cables and speakers. An inventorisatation of which shoe sizes are required will take place after the individual entry deadline. The OC will do its best to accommodate requests. Oars will be provided by Concept2. Sweep oars will have microfiber suede inner grips. All sweep outer grips and scull grips will be medium orange contour. Availability of alternate grip options will be limited and cannot be guaranteed. Details on your boat will be confirmed as soon as possible. North American crews are encouraged to bring their own boats and oars. There will be sufficient boat racks, and parking spaces for boat trailers.

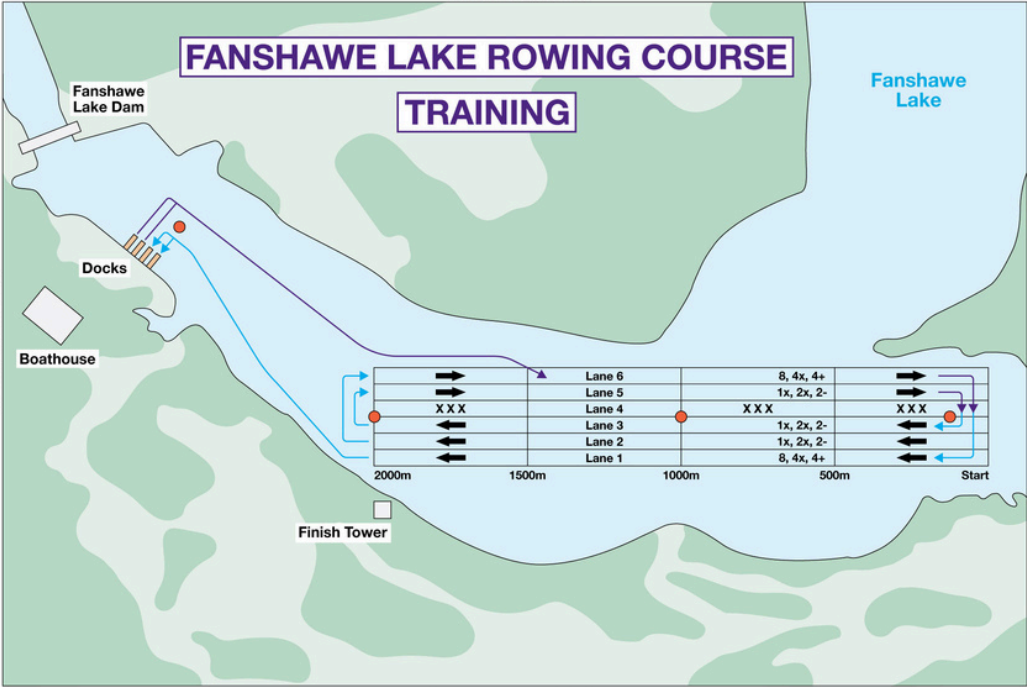


Competition Schedule

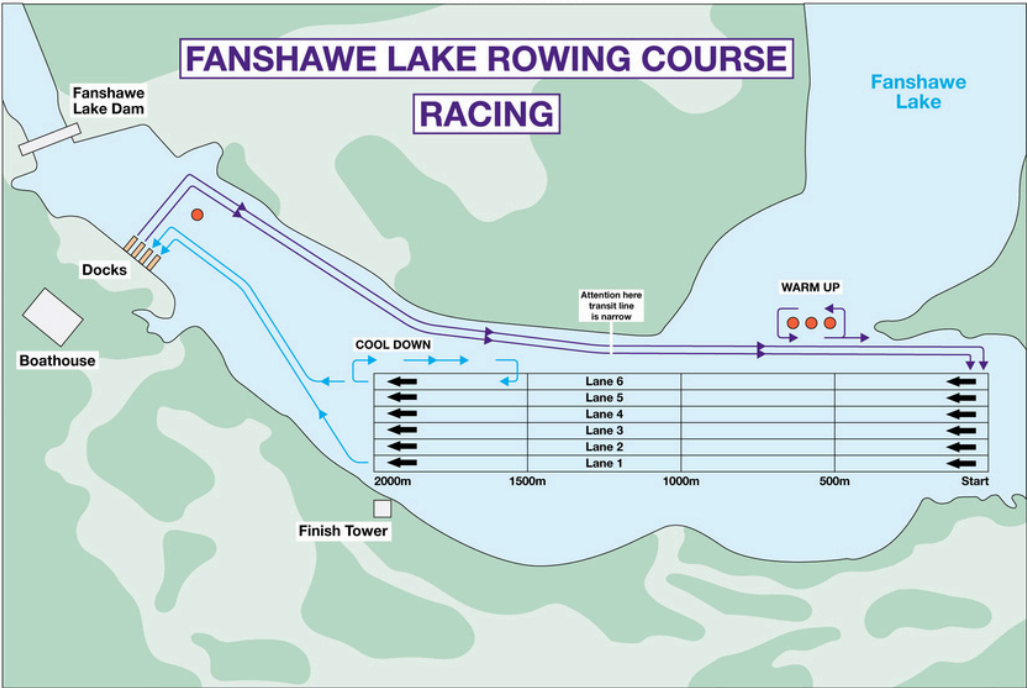

Services Included

Services

The 80 euros per night participation fee includes accommodations, breakfast, lunch and dinner, transportation to/from London International Airport and training venue. Breakfast and dinner will be served at the accommodations while lunch will be provided as a boxed lunch. Price for an extra official is 160 euros per night.

Medical Assistance

The Organizing Committee provides first aid at the completion venue. Additional support can be found through the Fowler Kennedy Sports Medicine Clinic on the Western Campus. Emergency medical needs should be directed to University Hospital or call 911.

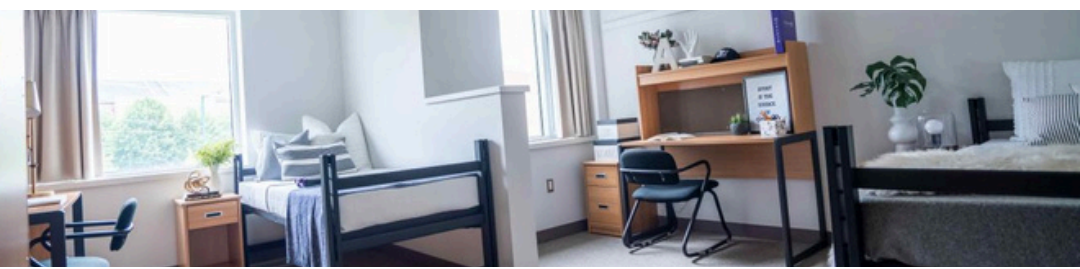
Anti-Doping

Doping control will be provided according to the FISU standards in partnership with Sport Integrity Canada.

Accommodations

All delegations will be housed at Ontario Hall and Huron College in the heart of the Western University campus. This will be the athletes village and is located minutes from indoor training facilities, central pickup/drop off points and other critical amenities.

For all spectators coming into London for the event, visit [our website](#) to explore local accommodation options. London offers a variety of accommodation options spread across the city at various price points, suited for any and all travelers. Hotel partners *are currently* posted on the event webpage, offering preferred rates.



Transportation

Flights to the London International Airport (YXU) are available via Toronto Pearson Airport (YYZ). Alternatively, shuttles, car rentals, and train service is available to London from Toronto.

Once in London, transportation will be provided by the LOC between the YXU airport and accommodations, as well as between accommodations and our competition venue.

It is the responsibility of the visiting delegation to acquire a visa/eTA to enter Canada if applicable. Letters of invitations with ONLY be issued once 50% deposit is paid.

ELECTRONIC TRAVEL AUTHORIZATION (eTA) – CANADA

Individuals travelling to Canada may require either a Visitor Visa (Temporary Resident Visa) or an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA), depending on their country of citizenship. Delegations should verify entry requirements through Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) before making travel arrangements.

Citizens of visa-exempt countries who are flying to Canada will generally require an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA). Information on eligibility and the application process can be found on the [Government of Canada website](#). Please note that all team/delegation members must submit individual applications.

When applying for an eTA or Visitor Visa, applicants may be required to provide information regarding their travel plans in Canada, including the address of their accommodation (**Ontario Hall, Western University, 230 Sarnia Rd. London ON, N6G 0N2**), contact information for event organizers (**Daniel Bechard dbechar5@uwo.ca / 519 859 9240**), passport details, employment history, personal contact information, and emergency contact details.

Most eTA applications are processed quickly, often within minutes; however, some applications may require additional review and processing time. Delegations are strongly encouraged to apply well in advance of travel.

All travellers entering Canada must hold a valid passport. Depending on their country of citizenship, travellers may also need to provide supporting documentation regarding the purpose of their visit, and satisfy Canadian border officials that they will leave Canada at the end of their authorized period of stay.

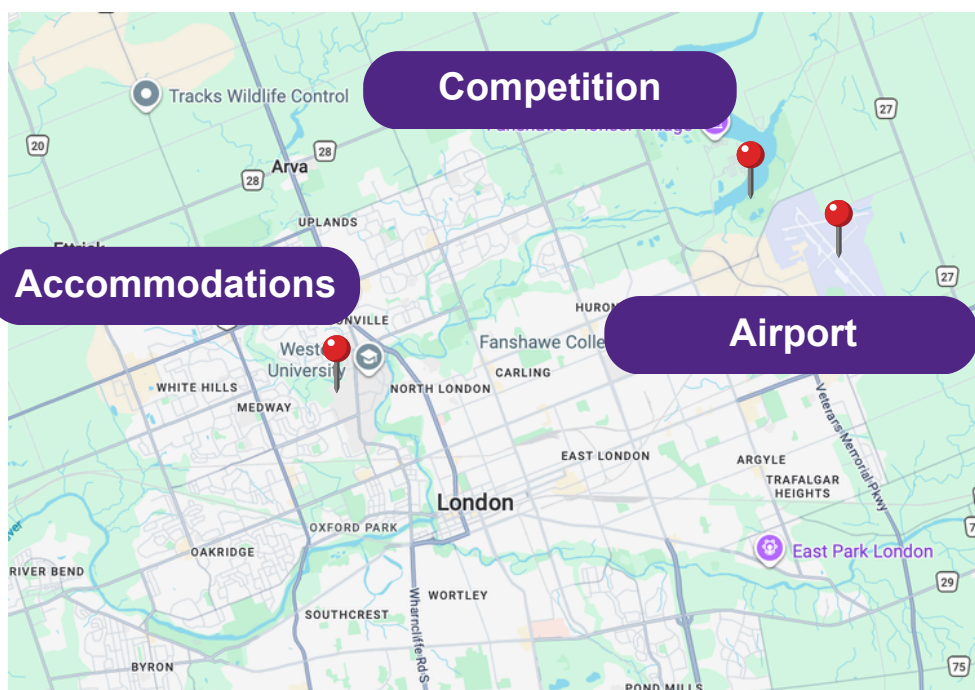

The Organizing Committee will provide group transportation between the London International Airport and accommodations, as well as between the training/racing venue and accommodations at no additional costs.

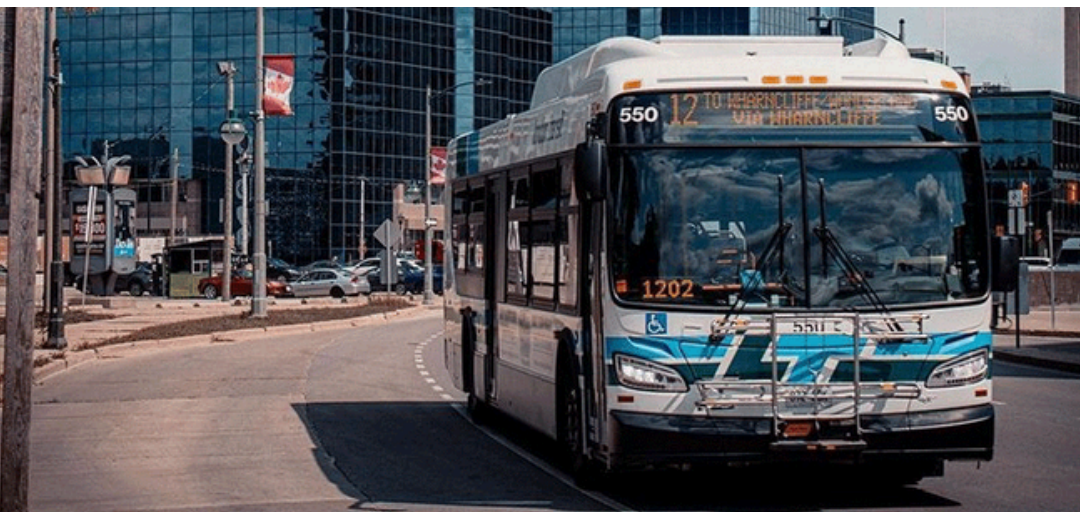
Additional transportation throughout the City of London can be accessed at the participants cost. London offers a variety of transportation options to help visitors travel throughout the city. The London Transit Commission (LTC) operates an extensive bus network connecting major destinations, including Western University, downtown, hotels, shopping centres, and recreation facilities. For those seeking direct transportation, taxi services are widely available, including local providers such as Yellow London Taxi and U-Need-A Cab. Ride-sharing services, including Uber, also operate throughout the city and can be accessed through their mobile apps.

Visitors who prefer active transportation can take advantage of London's growing network of multi-use pathways and cycling routes, while many hotels offer shuttle services to popular destinations. Whether travelling to training sessions, competition venues, restaurants, or attractions, participants will find a range of convenient and affordable transportation options available throughout their stay.
